We wish to thank the HTF trustees for this wonderful opportunity for Scotties and their owners throughout our region to obtain an ultrasound. As committee chair, Carol Mallquist, said in our cover letter:

"With a membership which includes members from Michigan, Wisconsin, Indiana, Iowa and Illinois, our regional club serves a multi-state geographic area, including the Milwaukee metropolitan community, with the potential of serving a large number of Scottie owners through this opportunity who may not have access to ultrasound screening at an affordable cost. We feel that we have secured the services of a respected veterinary sonographer(s) at a location ideally assessable via interstates to serve a maximum number of participants. This is a valuable opportunity to promote the health of the breed through early detection."

Anyone interested in attending the 2020 National Rotating Specialty in Dayton, Ohio, March 21, 2020, should let our secretary, Beryl, know ASAP if you would like to go. We would love to have several of us represent STCC at this event. We can carpool or caravan; whatever it takes to make this happen. It should be as fun as it is educational. This is our last chance to attend a Rotating Specialty before we host our own in 2021. The more eyes and ears at this Specialty will better prepare us for 2021.



For Your K9 is a spacious, well-established dog training/trial facility centrally located to Chicagoland and easily accessible via a network of connecting expressways, from the City of Chicago, to the west, north, into Northwest Indiana, southern and southwestern suburbs, and far western suburbs and cities, as well as the northwestern Illinois towns/cities into Wisconsin and Central/Southern Illinois towns/cities. There is plentiful parking and a dark room for the sonograms, as well as onsite amenities for waiting Scottie owners.

Sonography: 4 Paws Imaging, Katlynn Weedman 2040 Riverwalk Court, Ste. 114, Plainfield, IL 60544 (630) 746-1382

Katlynn is an experienced veterinary technician who received her ultrasound certification from Sound Academy of Veterinary Imaging in February, 2018. Since her certification she has become a proud partner of 4 Paws Imaging.

Estimated Scotties: 60 to 80, or more.

Depending on the final number pre-registered, a second sonographer will be made available through 4 Paws Imaging. Additionally, a board-certified veterinary radiologist will be available to read the scans as they are transmitted.

Cost:

The actual cost per scan is \$81.00. This includes the scan, and a flash drive with the images, so that each owner can take them to their own vet. However, with the assistance of, and partnership with, the STCA HTF grant, our club can accommodate the first 70 dogs who register (pre-registration preferred) at a cost of only \$60.00, which will include the flash drive with images. The STCA HTF is partnering with us to cover the additional \$21.00 to fulfill the actual cost of these first 70 dogs .

Additionally, three of these initial 70 scans will be offered pro-bono through the STCA HTF fund, for those who can show financial hardship.

We have a lot of planning to do for Rotating 2021, and we will need to keep in mind what we "typically" spend, so that we keep an eye on additional expenditures for that year, such as marketing and increased advertising. As soon as we receive the GLATA reconciliation from our June 2019 show, I will get it out to everyone. GLATA SOP's state that we should receive it by September 1st following the show.

#### STCA GRANT AVAILABILITY

From an Editor (Marilyn Flanagan). After thoroughly reading (front to back, every page) of The Bagpiper, Issue 2019 #4 - and knowing we are now in sight of our first rotating since the 80's??? I approached STCC member and STCA Treasurer, Steve Russell, with some questions. My questions came from perusing the minutes of STCA board minutes. What I have learned is:



"Regarding Regional Clubs: The STCA grants \$1,000 to each Regional Club hosting Rotating. The STCC will receive this without requesting it. Normally, STCA pays that out the year before the Rotating Specialty, when the show application is submitted. I send those payments as Treasurer.

In addition, the STCA awards two grants per year to Regional Clubs to help defray the cost of hosting events that provide a public service (such as Meet the Breed booths, Grooming Seminars, etc.). The Regional Clubs must submit proposals. You can work with the Regional Club chair, currently, Christine O'Brien on that."

I am very thankful to Steve Russell for sending this information. And, I am willing to help in any way I can with grant proposals towards these "hosting our event" grants. Great information to know!! And, I hope to share more information next issue on Junior Handlers and how much STCA appreciates their efforts!!

The Scottish Terrier Club of Chicago

The Scottish Terrier Club of Chicago was founded in 1930 by T.E. Weible and Mrs. M.F. Hills. On September 17, 1979, we were formally incorporated as a Not For Profit in the State of Illinois.

Our club is the 2nd oldest Scottish Terrier club in the nation. (California being the oldest club.) It is interesting to note that in 1959 there were still only eleven regional clubs. However, today, STCC is proud to be one of twenty Scottish Terrier regional clubs recognized by the Scottish Terrier Club of America.

STCC held its first Specialty show in November, 1930. Today, our Specialty shows are held annually the third Saturday of June at the Lake County Fairgrounds in Grayslake, IL.

Across the years our club has changed leadership and direction, as has every regional club. The allure of the Scottish Terrier has decreased, and nationally there is a strong conversation as to how to rebuild the breed, and our clubs. At our height we had 80 members. Although our membership declined, our current initiative is to expand our clubs footprint, and we are reaching out full force to add new members and, thus new energy and ideas. Today we boast 57 members and counting.

Most of our tenured members have served this club in a leadership capacity - at least once. And, there is a strong knowledge base across our club, focused on our mission. Breeders, exhibitors, and those with companion Scotties have come together with determination to improve the lives and futures of our Scotties.

In recent years, successes have been made for our breed. A test is available for Cushings Syndrome through Dr. Zimmerman and UTenn. Studies at Purdue University have increased our knowledge of bladder cancer. A home collection kit, made possible by Dr. Breen, allows owners to send in urine samples for diagnosis.
